## **COMPLIANCE AUDIT REPORT**

## FOR THE PERIOD

## **JANUARY 1, 2006, TO DECEMBER 31, 2008**



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#### BACKGROUND

On December 18, 1984, the Pennsylvania Legislature adopted the Municipal Pension Plan Funding Standard and Recovery Act (P.L. 1005, No. 205, as amended, 53 P.S. § 895.101 <u>et seq.</u>). The act established mandatory actuarial reporting and funding requirements and a uniform basis for the distribution of state aid to Pennsylvania's public pension plans. Section 402(j) of Act 205 specifically requires the Auditor General, as deemed necessary, to make an audit of every municipality which receives general municipal pension system State aid and of every municipal pension plan and fund in which general municipal pension system State aid is deposited.

Pension plan aid is provided from a 2 percent foreign casualty insurance premium tax, a portion of the foreign fire insurance tax designated for paid firefighters and any investment income earned on the collection of these taxes. Generally, municipal pension plans established prior to December 18, 1984, are eligible for state aid. For municipal pension plans established after that date, the sponsoring municipality must fund the plan for three plan years before it becomes eligible for state aid. In accordance with Act 205, a municipality's annual state aid allocation cannot exceed its actual pension costs.

In addition to Act 205, the South Mahoning Township Nonuniformed Pension Plan is also governed by implementing regulations adopted by the Public Employee Retirement Commission published at Title 16, Part IV of the Pennsylvania Code and applicable provisions of various other state statutes including, but not limited to, the following:

Act 69 - The Second Class Township Code, Act of May 1, 1933 (P.L. 103, No. 69), as reenacted and amended, 53 P.S. § 65101 et seq.

The South Mahoning Township Nonuniformed Pension Plan is a single-employer defined contribution pension plan locally controlled by the provisions of a resolution adopted July 7, 1997, as amended. Active members are not required to contribute to the plan. The municipality is required to contribute 8 percent of each member's compensation.

We have conducted a compliance audit of the South Mahoning Township Nonuniformed Pension Plan for the period January 1, 2006, to December 31, 2008. The audit was conducted pursuant to authority derived from Section 402(j) of Act 205 and in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* applicable to performance audits issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform our audit to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to provide a reasonable basis for our finding and conclusions based on our audit objectives. We believe that the evidence obtained provides a reasonable basis for our finding and conclusions based on our audit objectives.

The objectives of the audit were:

- 1. To determine if municipal officials took appropriate corrective action to address the findings contained in our prior audit report; and
- 2. To determine if the pension plan was administered in compliance with applicable state laws, regulations, contracts, administrative procedures, and local ordinances and policies.

Our audit was limited to the areas related to the objectives identified above.

Township officials are responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure to provide reasonable assurance that the South Mahoning Township Nonuniformed Pension Plan is administered in compliance with applicable state laws, regulations, contracts, administrative procedures, and local ordinances and policies. To assist us in planning and performing our audit, we obtained an understanding of the township's internal control structure as it relates to the township's compliance with those requirements. Additionally, we tested transactions, assessed official actions, performed analytical procedures and interviewed selected officials to the extent necessary to satisfy the audit objectives.

The results of our tests indicated that, in all significant respects, the South Mahoning Township Nonuniformed Pension Plan was administered in compliance with applicable state laws, regulations, contracts, administrative procedures, and local ordinances and policies, except as noted in the following finding further discussed later in this report:

Finding – Receipt Of State Aid In Excess Of Entitlement

The accompanying supplementary information is presented for purposes of additional analysis. We did not audit the information and, accordingly, express no form of assurance on it.

The contents of this report were discussed with officials of South Mahoning Township and, where appropriate, their responses have been included in the report.

## SOUTH MAHONING TOWNSHIP NONUNIFORMED PENSION PLAN STATUS OF PRIOR FINDINGS

#### Compliance With Prior Audit Recommendations

South Mahoning Township has complied with the prior audit recommendations concerning the following:

#### · Incorrect Data On Certification Form AG 385 Resulting In An Overpayment Of State Aid

The township reimbursed \$275 to the Commonwealth for the overpayment of state aid received during the prior audit period;

#### • Failure To Prepare Required Notes To The Financial Statements

During the current audit period, plan officials prepared annual financial statements which included note disclosures; and

• Untimely Deposit Of State Aid

During the current audit period, all state aid received by the municipality was deposited into the pension plan within 30 days of receipt.

#### SOUTH MAHONING TOWNSHIP NONUNIFORMED PENSION PLAN FINDING AND RECOMMENDATION

#### Finding – Receipt Of State Aid In Excess Of Entitlement

<u>Condition</u>: The township received state aid in excess of the nonuniformed pension plan's defined contribution pension costs in the year 2006, as illustrated below:

Criteria: Section 402(f)(2) of Act 205 states:

No municipality shall be entitled to receive an allocation of general municipal pension system State aid in an amount which exceeds the aggregate actual financial requirements of any municipal pension plans for police officers, paid firefighters or employees other than police officers or paid firefighters maintained by the municipality, less the amount of any aggregate annual member or employee contributions during the next succeeding plan year, as reported in the most recent complete actuarial report filed with the commission.

<u>Cause</u>: Plan officials were unaware of the need to annually reconcile the amount of state aid allocated to the pension plan with the plan's annual defined contribution pension costs.

<u>Effect</u>: It is this department's opinion that since the entire proceeds of the insurance premium tax on foreign casualty insurance companies are distributed annually to each eligible recipient municipality, it is inappropriate to use state aid received in one year to offset pension costs in other years. Consequently, the overpayment of state aid in the year 2006, in the total amount of \$771, must be returned to the Commonwealth for redistribution.

<u>Recommendation</u>: We recommend that the municipality return the \$771 of excess state aid received in the year 2006 to the Commonwealth. A check in this amount, with interest compounded annually from date of receipt to date of repayment, at a rate earned by the plan, should be made payable to: Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and mailed to: Department of the Auditor General, Municipal Pension & Fire Relief Programs Unit, 1205 Pittsburgh State Office Building, 300 Liberty Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15222. A copy of the interest calculation must be submitted along with evidence of payment.

## Finding – (Continued)

We also recommend that, in the future, plan officials reconcile the amount of state aid allocated to the nonuniformed pension plan with the plan's annual defined contribution pension costs.

Management's Response: Municipal officials agreed with finding without exception.
