

Dear Mr. Weimer and Mr. Mack:

We conducted a Limited Procedures Engagement (LPE) of the Eastern Westmoreland Career and Technology Center (Center) to determine its compliance with certain relevant state laws, regulations, policies, and administrative procedures (relevant requirements). The LPE covers the period July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2018, except for any areas of compliance that may have required an alternative to this period. The engagement was conducted pursuant to authority derived from Article VIII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and The Fiscal Code (72 P.S. §§ 402 and 403), but was not conducted in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

As we conducted our LPE procedures, we sought to determine answers to the following questions, which serve as our LPE objectives:

- Did the Center have documented board policies and administrative procedures related to the following?
  - Internal controls
  - Budgeting practices
  - o The Right-to-Know Law
  - o The Sunshine Act
- Were the policies and procedures adequate and appropriate, and have they been properly implemented?
- Did the Center comply with the relevant requirements in the Right-to-Know Law and the Sunshine Act?

Our engagement found that the Center properly implemented policies and procedures for the areas mentioned above and complied, in all significant respects, with relevant requirements.

We also evaluated the application of best practices in the area of school safety. Due to the sensitive nature of this issue and the need for the results of this review to be confidential, we did not include the results in this report. However, we communicated the results of our review of school safety to Center officials, the Pennsylvania Department of Education, and other appropriate officials as deemed necessary.

We appreciate the Center's cooperation during the conduct of the engagement.

All students will complete a rigorous, relevant program that equips them with the knowledge and real world skills necessary in both post-secondary education and 21<sup>st</sup> century careers.




Derry Area Greater Latrobe Ligonier Valley








**Note:** General Fund Balance is comprised of the District's Committed, Assigned and Unassigned Fund Balances.


**Note:** Total Debt is comprised of Short-Term Borrowing, General Obligation Bonds, Authority Building Obligations, Other Long-Term Debt, Other Post-Employment Benefits, Compensated Absences and Net Pension Liability.





**Note:** Career and technical centers do not make payments to charter schools for tuition. These payments are made by the home district of each student.

## **Financial Information Continued**



Local revenues were primarily obtained from direct payments by the member districts based on the approved budget. Each district's proportionate share of the operating expenditures was determined by a formula involving average daily membership as specified in the Articles of Agreement.

## **Academic Information**

SPP benchmarks represent the statewide average of all district school buildings in the Commonwealth. PSSA benchmarks and goals are determined by PDE each school year and apply to all public school entities. 2

Part-time career and technical centers, such as the Eastern Westmoreland Career and Technology Center, do not receive academic scores. Academic instruction in the core content areas occurs in the students' home district and are therefore reported within the scores of the students' home district. Full-time comprehensive career and technical centers providing core content receive academic scores.

## **4 Year Cohort Graduation Rates**

Part-time career and technical centers do not report a graduation rate. Each students' graduation rate is reported through the home district for that student. Full-time comprehensive career and technical centers report graduation rates to PDE.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Statewide averages for SPP scores were calculated based on all district school buildings throughout the Commonwealth, excluding charter and cyber charter schools.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> PSSA benchmarks apply to all district school buildings, charters, and cyber charters. In the 2011-12 school year, the state benchmarks reflect the Adequate Yearly Progress targets established under No Child Left Behind. In the 2012-13 and 2013-14 school years, the state benchmarks reflect the statewide goals based on annual measurable objectives established by PDE.
